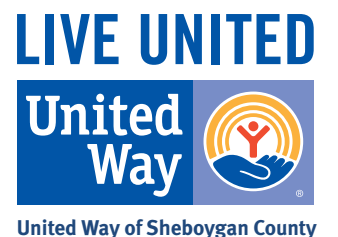

GOAL:

Sheboygan County's children receive a quality education that leads to a stable job.

FOCUS AREA: Born to Succeed

A parent & family support program serving families with children birth to four-year-old kindergarten, designed to support child development and school achievement by empowering parents. More than 12 partnerships have been created to support the four-tier model.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

For every 50 children who don't learn to read by the end of kindergarten, 44 of them will still have trouble in 3rd grade. Low grades and absenteeism rates by 3rd grade are strong predictors of high school dropouts.
