Check-in: Grief Support

- LOVE INC reached out to 40 churches, so far there are 6 pastors (representing 4 denominations) that will
 take calls for grief support. Call into LOVE INC's call center (920-783-6701 and press option 2) and they will
 align the client with a pastor.
- Salvation Army's Emotional & Spiritual Care Line also available 9AM-9PM 7 days a week at 1-888-651-7294.

General Discussion of client needs:

Housing

- Colleen (Lakeshore CAP) reported that they have additional assistance for those with lost income due to COVID-19, but have yet to receive any applications for those circumstances. They are still waiting on additional funding from the government.
- o Erin (Lakeshore Community Health Care) following up with homeless shelter.
 - Adrianna (Salvation Army) there are rooms available. They do have quarantine rooms. They are currently limiting their intake to 40 (down from 45).
 - Updates from Sheboygan Housing Coalition. (An afterhours shelter plan is being discussed.)

Food/Hygiene

- o Pam (LOVE INC) reported 4 churches that are able to deliver the food bank boxes. (Locations include: Gibbsville 'Goffers', Plymouth, Sheboygan Falls, and Sheboygan)
- Andrea (LSS Rays program) has increased their youth food and hygiene pantry (accessible to all youth under 18 in the county). They are also able to do some home delivery. They collect information ahead of time to include feminine hygiene products if needed. They can do a box for each child.
- Patrick (Sheboygan County Food Bank) With funding from relief fund, they are putting two hygiene items per food box. (Note: they are looking into requests for feminine products for future specific boxes.)
- o Salvation Army also provides hygiene products and have them currently in stock.
- Hygiene Discussion, to those not on the call reach out to Katelyn Piper or Patrick for information on collaborated efforts to share hygiene products.

Childcare

Matricia (Family Connection) reported 18 child care providers open right now for essential workers.
 Normally there are 50-60 providers open in the community. <u>4.7.20 Sheboygan County Child Care Provider</u>
