Other Facts & Solutions

- On any given day, about 11,000 people in Sheboygan County may struggle with hunger.
- 1 in 3 people in Sheboygan County live below the <u>ALICE threshold</u>. Food security is one of the biggest challenges for ALICE households.
- "Even when our schools are closed, food continues to be provided for FREE," Meredith Nitka, Sheboygan Area
 School District as she references the approved additional funds awarded recently.
- Last year, serving an average of 1000 clients per month and now the Sheboygan County Food bank is serving up to 9,500 a month; distributing an average of 214,000 pounds of food each month (approximately 300% increase from 2019's monthly average distribution). Also, their annual food purchase expenses have increased 445% (over \$300,000 already spent through September 2020).

- In 2019, 30,000 meals were provided through the Sheboygan Area School District's Summer Food Program. This summer 133,000 meals were provided.
- Feeding 300 homebound community members a week; food costs have increased 40% Meals On Wheels
- "We don't see hunger necessarily, but the need is there!" Allison Thompson, Meals On Wheels.
